Obey

Scripture References: Psalm 34:10, Psalm 37:25, Deut.28:1-14

It's easy to quote verses in Deuteronomy which say "...I am above and not beneath, the head and not the tail, the lender and not the borrower.." but too often we stop at verse 14. However if you continue to read you clearly see that these promises are conditional. If we do not obey the Lord cursings are in our future rather than blessings. Just as a parent lays out rules and expectations for their children in the natural, God has laws for His children. When my toddler fails to obey my rules certain privileges are revoked. God operates in this same manner. When we disobey His Word we do not have access to the blessings that come from being His Child. For example, my daughter loves her iPad and I am constantly reminding her of rules in effort to shape her into a respectful member of society. Likewise God has given us His Word in effort to shape us into effective Holy Ghost filled members of His Family. In order for my child to access the iPad, she must obey the rules. In order for us to access the blessings that God has laid out for His children we must first have a heart of obedience, and a heart that welcomes the reproof of God. Just as a parent assures their child that the rules (while sometimes inconvenient and uncomfortable) are for their own good, The Lord tells us that these guidelines will not only equate to a life of abundance on Earth, but a blissful eternity in heaven. Obedience can look different in each stage of life as we strive to walk closer to Him each day. So, let's search our hearts - shall we? Ask the Lord to show you any area(s) in your life that need pruning. Where have you fallen short? Where can you sacrifice more? Where is He leading you? It's time to say "yes".

Give

Scripture References: 2 Cor. 9:6-8, Luke 6:38

The best way that we can think about giving is imagining the actual action involved when we give with our hands. Once we release what is in our hands we then have an open palm, and room to receive. The more I study the word of God it seems that His kingdom functions with opposites. Need a friend? Present yourself friendly. Have a financial need? Give in tithes and offerings. Need a blessing? Be a blessing. Need a miracle? Believe for one - even when it seems impossible. You see, it seems that as we act in our giving, with faith propelling us forward we have the perfect recipe to receive from the Lord. Now, don't limit God to only providing for you financially, His provision is boundless and certainly stretches to the avenues of mental peace, physical healing and restoration in your most cherished relationships. So today take time to reflect over your giving. Are you believing God for much without showing him proof that you believe in His provision? I am living proof that God stretches my 90% MUCH further than my 100% could have ever gone. God is constantly asking us to trust him a little more, believe a little bigger - are you willing to say yes today? Ask the Lord where you can give, and give with a cheerful heart.

Ask

Scripture References: Philippians 4:6, Philippians 4:19, Luke 11:9, Luke 11:13

I believe there is much power in this simple key - Ask. When you read through the scriptures outlined above you can see that God is a giver. However, just as earthly parents only give to their children when it will do them good, God only gives when our heart is in alignment with His. Spend time asking God to first check your heart. Are there any motives within you driving these requests that are impure? Once you feel that the requests you have for God are formed out of a pure heart boldly take your request to the throne room (see Hebrews 4:16). There was a time in our marriage when we were struggling to making ends meet. Rather than claiming poverty I began to search the word of God and discovered that some of the mightiest men in the scriptures were very well off financially. It was then that I discovered that God didn't take joy in seeing me stress about having enough money to put food on the table night after night, so I began to pray. I claimed verses about having more than enough, about How God plans to prosper and not to harm me, and I reminded the enemy that I was a tithe! I asked the Lord for a financial increase at our current place of employment or an open door someplace else that would be able to help us provide better for our family. Spoiler alert - He did it! When I began to pray faith filled prayers, backed by scriptures with a pure heart God moved and opened doors that same week! Since we know the ground is level at calvary, I am confident he will do this same thing for you. Take time to write your requests out before God. I also encourage you to find scripture that lights your faith-fire like I did. Hold onto these stories in the scripture and proclaim the promises of God over your life as you take your needs before him. Ask and you will receive, according to the Father which is in heaven.can I get an amen?

Faith & Focus

Scripture References: Hebrews 11, Luke 12:24-34

Before you continue reading flip your Bible open to the book of Hebrews, Chapter 11. Give this a read and come back, as I know this chapter will supercharge your faith.

(read Hebrews Ch. 11)

Just as the chapter you read outlines the great Fathers of Faith you too can be a hero of faith within your family. To receive anything from God we must believe him for it. Often we read a great message in the scriptures or we hear a good sermon and we begin to believe God for his promised provision, and then the enemy comes and places doubt, discouragement and distraction.

This is why we must not only have Faith to believe God for his word, but Focus to KEEP believing until we see it manifest within our lives. Today I encourage you to ask God to fine tune your faith and focus. What "junk" is crowding your life and mind that need to be purged? What distractions do you allow into your mind on a daily basis that shift your mind from God and his promises, to the flesh and its promised mess? Write out a plan for zeroing in your focus on the promises of God and pray that the Holy Spirit helps your unbelief. For some this may look like more time searching the word of God, while for others it could be a simple time of rest at His feet where you unload the cares of this world, and grab ahold of the provision that God has for you, His child.
